



A Proper Eyeful

Nestled together, the grow-bags form an emphatic C-shaped boundary around the space, open along the river to create an amphitheatre for special occasions, with good all-round surveillance of the gardens' inclined surfaces. Some modules will be planted, with one incorporating a sensory garden; others will be surfaced to make performance spaces and play areas. Surfaces will be robust, with path edges that curve up at the grow-bags' bases, to stop litter accumulating and to be a cue for people with visual impairment. To keep these gardens special, we will suggest that some parts are closed at night. There will be a cafe, wedged into the cleavage of two grow-bags, offering a nice cuppa and an extraordinary view.
